Hi Wendy

I was talking to a guy from Centelink today and he advised me that:

If any person with a pension card who is travelling interstate, needs an Ambulance and is not covered by private health insurance or the South Australian ambulance subscription scheme. They could be liable for the whole amount of the account. He told me that some people are in the belief that the national pension card will get them free ambulance transport anywhere in Australia. That is not always the case and interstate services do NOT have to accept a pension card. He quoted one elderly pensioner lady that recently required an ambulance in Victoria and ended up with a \$900.00 bill and Centelink could do nothing to help her.

With the annual AGM coming up and there will be many members who are on pensions and will be travelling to Queensland. It may be timely to put something in the Odyssey warning them that they need to be in either private health insurance or the SA ambulance scheme to ensure they are covered in the event of an accident. Imagine coming off the bike miles from anywhere and being airlifted out by rescue helicopter. A nasty shock might await them when the account comes in.

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

3rd Feb Day Ride to Angaston


3rd March Day Ride to Yank



Note – all official rides will have a ride leader and tail end Charlie –(who will always be last at the back of the group). We will also use Corner Marshals when the ride leader thinks it is required. This means the rider immediately behind the leader will stop and wait on the corner when the ride leader indicates by pointing to the corner. This rider will then remain on the corner directing other riders until tail end Charlie passes. If you are willing to be corner marshal then you need to ride up front behind the ride leader. If you don't then do not ride immediately behind the ride leader. The system will work if adhered to and lets everyone ride with the confidence that they will not get lost or left behind. The ride leader is responsible for relaying the route to the group prior to leaving and - with the tail end Charlie - for knowing how many bikes are in the group. If you intend leaving or joining the ride at a particular point please let the ride leader and tail end Charlie know in advance.
